## Glass beads for pavement-marking materials

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#### **PREFACE**

This Standard was prepared by the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee CH-003, Paints and Related Materials, to supersede AS/NZS 2009—2002, Glass beads for road-marking materials.

This Standard incorporates Amendment No. 1 (December 2007). The changes required by the Amendment are indicated in the text by a marginal bar and amendment number against the clause, note, table, figure or part thereof affected.

The objective of this Standard is to provide manufacturers, importers and users of glass beads for road-marking materials with a specification for the requirements applicable to glass beads.

The terms 'normative' and 'informative' have been used in this Standard to define the application of the appendix to which they apply. A 'normative' appendix is an integral part of a Standard, whereas an 'informative' appendix is only for information and guidance.
