This Handbook is intended to provide guidance for personnel engaged in mobile works. It is applicable to any works carried out by constantly moving vehicles, and covers works on all types of roads including expressways and freeways.

It is intended to be used primarily as a field reference guide to cover a specific area of roadworks signage. It contains only those provisions of AS 1742.3* that are considered to apply in the particular cases with which it deals, and for convenience, reproduces them in summary form. It is not intended to supersede AS 1742.3 and in any cases where there may appear to be differences in specified requirements or recommendations, or where matters could be interpreted differently from the parent Standard, it is intended that the Standard specification, recommendation or interpretation should prevail.
