Start of validity

This standard is due to take effect on 1 May 2009.

It should be noted that, in Germany, CE conformity marking of construction products will be permitted once this standard has been listed in the *Bundesanzeiger* (German Federal Gazette) and from the date given therein.

National foreword

This standard has been prepared by Technical Committee CEN/TC 241 "Gypsum and gypsum based products" (Secretariat: AFNOR, France).

The responsible German body involved in its preparation was the *Normenausschuss Bauwesen* (Building and Civil Engineering Standards Committee), Technical Committee NA 005-09-10 AA *Gips und Gipsprodukte*.

It should be noted that the designation "KLF" as used in Annex ZA of the German version may be replaced by the internationally used designation "NPD" (No performance determined).
