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National foreword

This standard has been prepared by CEN/TC 104 'Concrete and related products' (Secretariat: Germany).

The responsible German body involved in its preparation was the *Normenausschuss Bauwesen* (Building and Civil Engineering Standards Committee), Technical Committee 005-07-10 AA *Spritzbeton*.

After the deadline set in the European foreword for withdrawing conflicting national standards, this standard will partially replace DIN 18551:2005-01. By this deadline, the regulatory concept set out in this standard should be adopted at national level.

This changeover will involve the preparation of national application rules for implementing this standard, as well as additional documents setting out specifications for designing sprayed concrete constructions, if these are not then available at a European level.

This standard differs from DIN 18551:2005-01 as follows:

- Requirements regarding the characteristics, manufacture and conformity assessment of concrete have been modified to agree with the European concept developed in DIN EN 206-1; this involved major changes in the technical specifications for concrete;
- This standard no longer includes specifications dealing with the design and construction of structures and elements.
